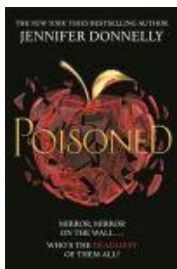


2021-22 RECOMMENDED READS – YEAR 8

	Attah, Ayesha Harruna The Deep Blue Between	At the turn of the 20th century, Hassana and Husseina are separated and enslaved. Once freed and cared for, they experience various cultures and religions as they try to survive in their new lives. This dual narrative explores the lives of twin sisters in the colonial worlds of the Gold Coast of Africa and Brazil. While they grow apart in distance, they remain connected through their dreams.	T
	Caldecott, Elen The Short Knife	This book is set in Britain just after the Romans have left and the country is plunged into the dark ages with Saxon warriors invading towns and villages. Mai is forced to leave their family farm and flee from the warriors into the dangerous hills where British warlords lie in wait. A story of survival set in the Welsh countryside.	T
	Dassu, A M Boy, Everywhere	Sami and his family embark on a harrowing journey from Syria to the UK via a smuggler's den in Turkey to escape the bombing in their country. But Sami hates it in the UK, he had a privileged life in Syria and now lives in poverty in Manchester where he is constantly bullied. All he wants is to return to his old life in Damascus.	T
	David, Keren What We're Scared of	Evie and Lottie are twins but are very different people - Evie is funny and sharp, Lottie is anxious and shy. The only thing they have in common is they are Jewish. It's not something they've given much thought about before but then their mother, in her new role as a radio host, starts being targeted by antisemitic trolls and they become caught up in the ugly threats made against them all. Poisoned

Snow White as you have never read it before. Sophie is kind and gentle and therefore a threat to her stepmother, the Queen, who orders a huntsman to cut out her heart. Luckily, seven brothers save her with a clockwork heart, but she must travel through the kingdom to find her real heart and her self belief if she is to survive and save the kingdom from the tyrannical queen. A dark but ultimately hopeful tale with plenty of adventure and twists along the way.

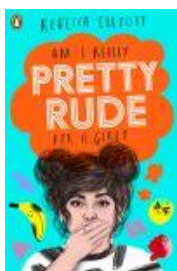


Dowswell, Paul

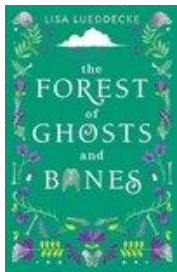


Gros, Kathleen

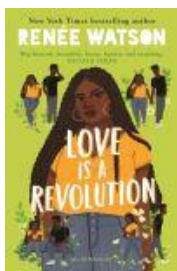

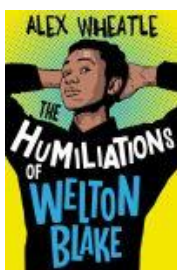


Wenxuan, Cao

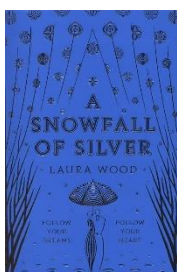


Williamson, Lisa
